IPPL receives many reports from holidaymakers each year about the unhappy sights of caged and chained up monkeys, and other wild animals. Continuously handled, photographed and forced to do tricks these poor creatures are there to attract the tourists and their money.

**Cheap entertainment, but the animals pay dearly in their pain and suffering**

Many animals die in the process of capture and transit and those that do survive are mistreated, and eventually disposed of, when they become sick, old or dangerous, to make way for a more appealing youngster. In most cases an individual monkey that may be saved is soon replaced by another unfortunate animal to attract the crowds.

IPPL needs you to report to us any situation where you believe a wild animal to be suffering for the sake of the tourist trade.

If you can take a photo, this is extremely helpful – you can smile as you take the picture for a souvenir. Please do not argue with the animal handlers.

We will compile a report on your objections to wild animals being used as tourist attractions. Each report will then be sent to the local mayor, tour agencies, tourist offices and major hotels of the respective country and area.

Your petition can still be used to make tourist offices and travel companies aware that animals used as 'tourist attractions' are damaging to the tourist trade.
